Ryan keeps cool to finish second



KUALA LUMPUR: Ryan Heng, who traces at Bukit Hill Golf and Country Resort, came out second in the "Eijay Jakarta World Junior Golf Championship" at Dharma Indah Golf Course in Pantai Indah Kapuk, Jakarta recently.

Competing in the boys' Under-10 division, Ryan played a solid and consistent game in the three-day tournament.

On the first day, the golfer from Kuala Lumpur shared second spot with Indonesian junior "Booker" Hasejo after shooting a four-over 76.

But Ryan surged ahead of Hasejo on the second day, despite the chal-

lenging conditions.

On the final day, Ryan, a trainee with Golf House Academy, proved his ability to compete in a top-class tournament by maintaining his cool and finishing second behind Thailand's Pavee Anagansakul.

Pavee collected a total score of 218 and finished nine strokes ahead Ryan.

Ryan, who started playing golf at six, emerged fourth at the 4th Trias Vision Junior Golf Championship at the St. Andrews 2000 course in Bayong, Bandung and finished six at the Sportland Junior Golf Circuit last year.

and there is no age limit for the participating teams," said Anis Mirza.

"In the inaugural event last year, 28 teams participated and proceeds went to a motivational camp for underprivileged children, which is a motivational camp held yearly for Form Four students who come from less fortunate backgrounds."

Proceeds will be presented in kind and not monetary.

"Besides that, teams will also vie to see who are the men's and women's futsal kingship of Subang Jaya."

Winners will receive medals, banners and also have the honour of presenting a mock cheque to the welfare home.

Teams will be charged an entry fee of RM120 each.
